Living with COVID

COVID-safe holiday period gatherings

This holiday period, protect yourself and others when entertaining guests, attending events and travelling.

COVID-safe [behaviours](#) are an important way to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and protect community members most at-risk of severe illness.

Stay at home if you're unwell to avoid further transmission. When leaving the home or travelling, consider carrying rapid antigen tests, masks and hand sanitiser for use when required.

The Australian Department of Health released [COVID-safe advice](#) for the general community.

Businesses, event managers and local government should follow all event-related policies, including the [Guidelines for Concerts, Events and Organised Gatherings 2022](#).

Evidence of being a confirmed case

People who test [positive](#) for COVID-19 may be asked to provide evidence of their positive test. If evidence is required, businesses and employers are encouraged to accept:

- a dated photograph of the positive rapid antigen test (RAT)
- the PCR test result from [My Health Record](#)
- the PCR test result text message
- the text message received from WA Health after registering the positive RAT result on [HealthyWA](#) or testing positive via PCR test.

People who test positive to COVID-19 via RAT are not required to have a PCR to confirm the result. Information for [employers and businesses](#) is available at the Department of Health website.

SCGH post-COVID syndrome referrals

Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital (SCGH) is now accepting referrals for the management of post-COVID syndrome (long-COVID). The service is coordinated by Respiratory Medicine where a multidisciplinary team provides care.

Referral criteria includes:

- multisystem symptoms or deficits
- present for more than 12 weeks after confirmed COVID-19 infection
- living within the [SCGH Catchment Area](#).

Individuals are encouraged to talk to their GP or medical service to determine appropriate post-COVID symptom management, including referral to the above (or similar) service.

EMHS post-COVID syndrome referrals

Bentley Health Service provides a post-COVID syndrome service through the East Metropolitan Health Service (EMHS) Post COVID-19 Clinic. The service is led by a Senior Physiotherapist.

Referral criteria includes:

- those over 16 years of age living within the [EMHS Catchment Area](#)
- being at least 12-weeks post diagnosis
- people experiencing significant, ongoing but non-urgent symptoms
- having objective physical findings which have failed to resolve with primary care and that cannot be attributed to other obvious causes or cognitive/psychological issues.

Individuals are encouraged to talk to their GP or medical service to determine appropriate post-COVID symptom management, including referral to the above (or similar) service.
