SUMMARY:

Council is requested to consider clarifying the Councillor Travel Reimbursement per kilometre rate for 2024-2025 which was adopted at the special council meeting of 29 August 2024.

BACKGROUND:

The Shire of West Arthur adopted the 2024-2025 budget at the special council meeting held on 29 August 2024. The Council Resolution SCM-2024-091, point 8, reads as follows:

8. That, in accordance with Section 5.99 of the Local Government Act 1995 and Regulation 34 of the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996, the Council adopts the following annual fees and allowances for elected members:

Allowance: Shire President	\$6,240 per annum
Allowance: Deputy Shire President	\$1,560 per annum
Councillor – Council meeting (OCM, SCM, and ARC)	\$210 per meeting
Councillor – Shire Committee and external meeting fee	\$105 per meeting
Independent Member Sitting fees	\$105 per meeting
Communications Allowance	\$520 per annum

• 1601-2600 cc	0.7855 cents/km
• 2601 cc and over	1.0929 cents/km

The consequences may be positive or negative or simply a deviation from the expected. The risk or consequence may be related to health and safety; financial; business or service interruption; compliance; reputation; or the environment. Reference to the risk matrix below will generate a risk rating by assessing the likelihood and consequence and multiplying these scores by each other. The greater the risk rating, the greater the risk and the higher the need for specific plans to be developed. All items with a risk rating greater than 10 should be added to the Risk Register and specific controls developed.
